## THE ACTIVITY REPORT OF THE MEDICAL OUTREACH 2020 PROGRAM OF DR. PATIENCE SELUMUN TSAVNANDE FOUNDATION (DPTF) HELD ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup> AND 3<sup>RD</sup> DECEMBER 2020

### 1.0 CURTESY VISIT

1.1 On the 1<sup>st</sup> December 2020, the Chairman of the Board of Trustees Sir Thaddeus Tsavnande and the Executive Secretary Chief D. C. Agera were at the Secretariat of Tarka Local government of Benue State for a curtesy visit. This was planned to get the leadership Tarka LG to buy into the medical outreach program.

1.2 The two Officers called on the Secretary of Tarka LG, Hon Juluku Mathias and briefed him of the planned medical outreach taking place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2020 at Atighir village. He was glad the outreach program is taking place in Tarka LG, he promised to attend the opening.

1.3 The Officers then visited the Chairman of Tarka LG, Mrs Juliana Suemo to brief her of the planned medical outreach. She welcomed the development and assured that she will personally be present to flag off the program.

### 2.0 DAY ONE OF THE MEDICAL OUTREACH

2.1 The occasion started with a morning mass held at the Catholic Church Atighir village Mbanoughul in Tarka Local Government Area of Benue State.

2.2 The venue of the medical outreach was the LGED Primary School Atighir village Mbanoughul in Tarka LG. Canopies and chairs were provide for both the guests and the beneficiaries. The classrooms were prepared for use of the medical team for the out-patient, Doctors' consulting rooms, laboratories and pharmacy.

2.3 The traditional rulers, elders, dignitaries, beneficiaries, guests and some Board of Trustee members were seated at about 9.30am. The beneficiaries were orderly and calm, waiting for the start of the program. The Information Officer of Tarka LGA Mr Daniel Ashivor anchored the programme. The

Chairman of Tarka LG Mrs Juliana Suemo and the Secretary of the LG Hon Juluku Mathias were the Special Guests of the occasion.

2.3 The medical team for the outreach comprised of 25 Medical personnel, this included 12 Medical Doctors, 6 Nurses, 5 Pharmacy staff and 3 Laboratory Science Technologists, their names are detailed below;

2.4 The programme commenced with the welcome address from the village head of Atighir, Tyoor Mbalahan, Chief Ajon Kumbur, represented by Ortar Mbaabunde, Chief Mgueibo Awa. The royal father thanked the Foundation for organizing the Medical Outreach program and especially considering Atighir village. He therefore implored the people to take advantage of the program for their benefit and prayed for the success of the program.

2.5 The Chairman Board of Trustees (BOT), Sir Thaddeus Tsavnande in his address, gave a brief background and explained the reasons why the Foundation thought of bringing the medical outreach to the Atighir village. It was

to further fulfil the desire of the late Dr Patience Selumun Tsavnande in providing medical services to the poor.

2.6 He called on all the beneficiaries to make the maximum use of the opportunity the Foundation is providing through the medical outreach for their good health. He also called on philanthropists, friends and well-wishers to join the Foundation by donating their widow's mite to bring succour to the poor. Particularly, he invited Tarka LG to partner with the Foundation to make the medical outreach a regular activity.

2.7 The Chairman of Tarka LG Mrs Juliana Suemo thanked the Foundation for initiating such a program, she also said the local government will support the Foundation as she acknowledged the benefits the program will bring to the beneficiaries. She welcomed beneficiaries and guests to the medical outreach program.

2.8 Thereafter she took a tour round all the service stations and encouraged the staff and beneficiaries.

2.9 The Chairman first greeted the patients waiting to take their turns, she greeted them and asked for their patience as every person present will be attended to according to the serial numberings.

2.10 Thereafter she visited the water station. In line with the COVID-19 protocols, every beneficiary was given a face mask and before being attended to, they wash their hands with soap and water.

2.11 She then called on the Nurses taking vital signs. The patients were on line taking their turns.

2.12 The next station was the four classrooms that were being used as Doctor's consulting rooms, the Chairman visited each and encouraged them.

2.13 The Chairman was at the Laboratory station and saw how the various tests were conducted on the patients who were eager but orderly.

2.14 Finally the Chairman called at the pharmacy where she did administer prescriptions to some of the patients under the guidance of the staff.

2.15 At the end of day 1, the patients treated were 400 persons. The outreach for that day ended at about 5.00pm.

### **3.0 DAY TWO OF THE MEDICAL OUTREACH**

3.1 As early as 6.00am patients started arriving the venue, they came early to take positions to wait for the medical team.

3.2 On the second day, we had a full complement of the medical team who came early. Services started as early as 8.00am

3.3 Having understood the processes better, work went smoother on the second day and the program came to end at about 3.00pm. By this time most of the drugs had been exhausted.

3.4 The total number of patients treated on day 2 were 653 persons.

### **4.0 PURCHASE OF DRUGS**

4.1 The drugs and other medical accessories for the Medical Outreach were purchased with the sum of Five Hundred and Forty-Five Thousand and Eight Naira (N545,008.00) only. See the detailed list of drugs in the appendix.

### **5.0 LOGISTICS**

#### **5.1 Transport**

Two vehicles were used to convey the drugs and four (4) Foundation BOT members; Sir Thaddeus Tsavnande, Lady Mercy Tsavnande, Mr Eric Tsavnande and the Executive Secretary Chief D. C. Agera. The cost of fuel and incidentals for the two vehicles was One Hundred and Twenty Thousand Naira (N120,000.00) only.

#### **5.2 Accommodation**

Hotel accommodation was provided at Sky Gate Suites at Annune for two nights for the medical team of 12 Doctors and 3 Lab Scientists for two nights at the cost Seventy-Seven Thousand Naira (N 77,000.00) only.

#### **5.3 Feeding**

Feeding was provided for two days for a 32-member team comprising; 26-member medical team, 4-BOT members, 2-drivers; at the cost of One Hundred and Sixty Thousand Naira (N160,000.00) only.

There were 25-member medical team and the following was paid as appreciation for their services for the two-day event;

## 10.0 ASSESSMENT

10.1 The assessment at the venue indicated that the program was successful. The plan was to attend to 500 beneficiaries, but from the prescription sheets after the conclusion of the program, the Foundation was able to treat 1,053 persons for the two days. Hence we achieved over 200% success.

10.2 With this result, we are satisfied that the medical outreach program was hugely successful.

## 11.0 CLOSING

11.1 The program came to a close on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2020 at about 3.00pm. All the medical team gathered after lunch at the residence of Sir Thaddeus

Tsavnande the BOT Chairman. Dr Kyoive Emmanuel spoke on behalf of the Doctors, he congratulated the Foundation for holding a medical outreach that has exceeded their expectations in the area of logistics, feeding, drugs and the quality of the medical team. He said all his colleagues shared the same sentiments. Dr Mathias Iortyer, the Medical Director of Atuna Clinics, who is also the Director Medical programs of the Foundation thanked the doctors and other medical staff who volunteered to be part of the medical outreach. He stated that it is the desire of the Foundation to in addition train female medical doctors in the near future.

The BOT Chairman thanked them for honouring the invitation to volunteer their services. This was a good way to honour their late colleague, Dr Patience Selumun Tsavnande. He prayed for their safe journey back to their various destinations.
